"MUST TRY"

Chocolate Rocky Road

200g milk chocolate
50g butter
100g digestives or rich tea
50g Cherries
50g mini marshmallows
50g Maltessers
1 tablespoon Golden Syrup

Method:

1. Put biscuits in a bag and use a wooden spoon to break into small pieces.
2. Chop cherries into small pieces.
3. Put broken biscuits, maltessers, cherries and marshmallows into bowl.
4. Break chocolate up into a bowl, add butter and golden syrup.
5. Melt chocolate and butter mixture.
6. Add dry ingredients to chocolate and carefully stir.
7. Place in tin and put in the refridgerator to set.
8. Remove from tray and cut into fingers.

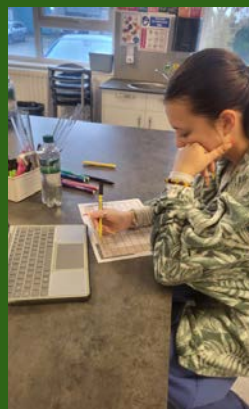
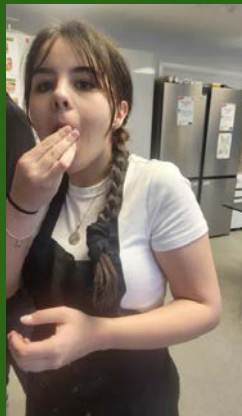

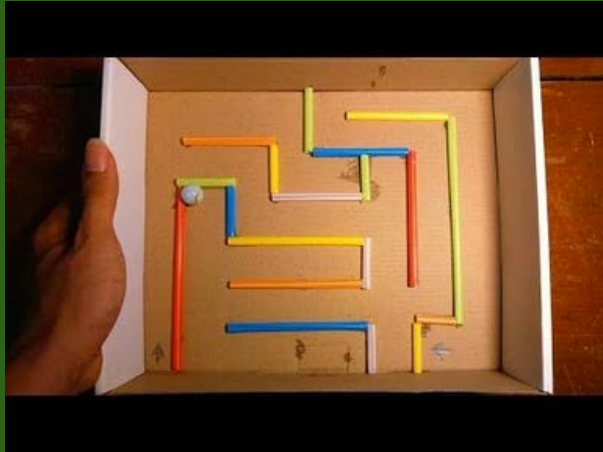


Clover Class

Clover class have been testing their engineering skills by making marble runs out of just cardboard, straws and playdoh. This activity helps with problem solving and ingenuity.



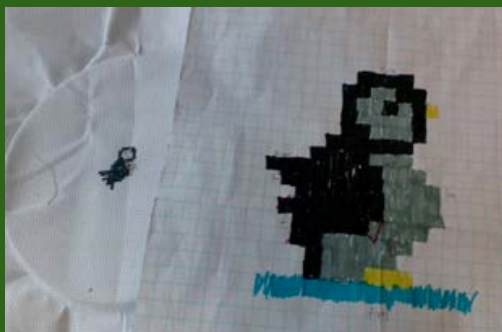
We have had some absolutely amazing stories written by our learners for their dystopian creative writing pieces. We are so proud of all of you!

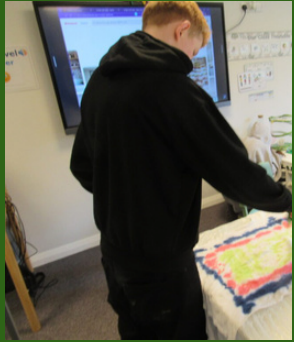

We have enjoyed a thoughtful and engaging term of learning in Gorse Class.



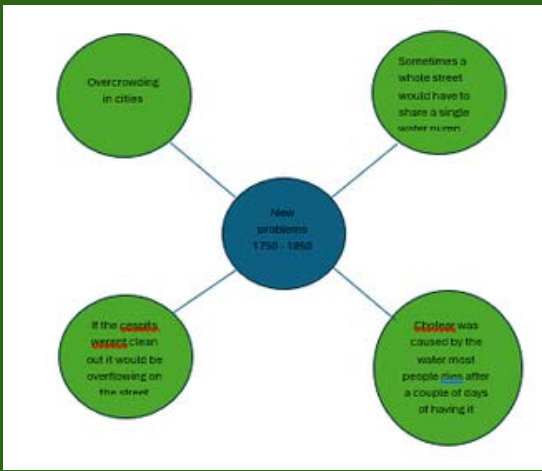
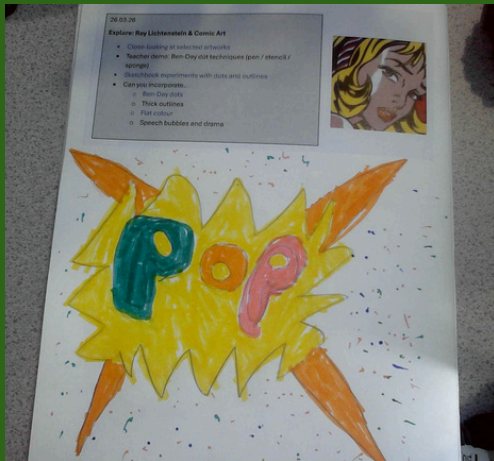
The Black Death


Treatments and Cures

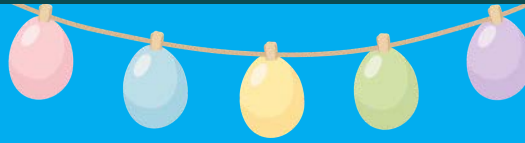

This week's RRSA Article of the Week focuses on Easter and explores the meaning of Article 14 – the right to freedom of thought, belief, and religion.

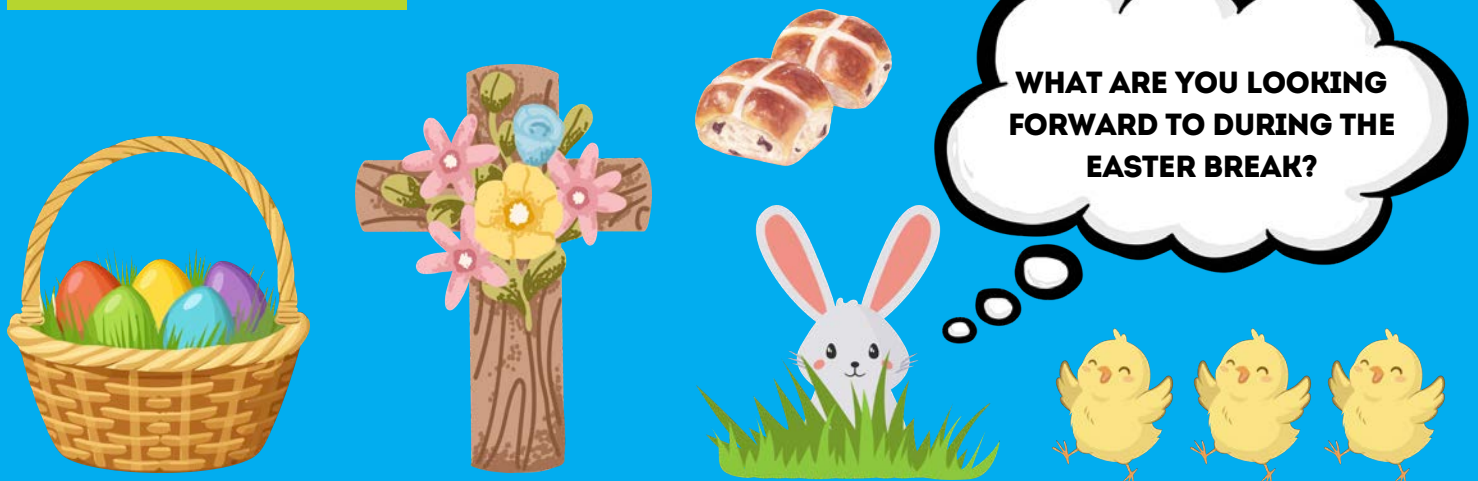
As we learn about Easter as an important Christian celebration, we also reflect on how this article protects everyone's right to follow their own beliefs or choose not to follow a religion at all.
